#### **Background:**

On Wednesday, 11 March 2020, the CEO received a signed and dated letter of resignation from the Shire President, Cr Ricky Storer from his dual offices of Councillor (under section 2.32 of the Local Government Act 1995) and Shire President (under section 2.34 of the Local Government Act 1995) for the Shire of Koorda effective from the close of business (i.e. 4.30pm) on Thursday, 19 March 2020.

Council, at its meeting on 18 March 2020 subsequently resolved:

#### That Council:

- 1. Notes Cr Ricky Storer's resignation as Shire President and Councillor for the Shire of Koorda;
- 2. Acknowledges and thanks Cr Ricky Storer for his 15 years of dedicated service to the Shire, Koorda community and the local government sector; and
- 3. Calls a special meeting of Council to be held on Monday, 23 March 2020 commencing at 5.00pm for the election and subsequent declaration to office of a new Shire President and to consider options for the conduct of an extraordinary election for the vacancy on Council arising from Cr Ricky Storer's resignation.

#### Comment:

At the Council Forum held on 18 March 2020, discussion ensued on the options available to Council in respect to whether the vacancy arising from Cr Ricky Storer's resignation should be filled as soon as possible or delayed until the October 2021 ordinary elections (subject to Electoral Commissioner approval), and whether, in light of the current COVID-19 (Coronavirus) crisis, the election is conducted as a postal rather than an in-person election.

There was consensus for the Shire to fill the vacancy as soon as possible under the postal election approach considering COVID-19 and as a trial of the alternative election methodology.

Council has received a cost estimate from Western Australian Electoral Commission (WAEC) for the extraordinary election if conducted as a postal ballot is \$11,000 including GST, which has been based on the following assumptions:

- 300 electors
- Response rate of approximately 50%
- · Count to be conducted at the offices of the Shire of Koorda
- Appointment of a local Returning Officer

Costs not incorporated in this estimate include:

- non-statutory advertising (i.e. any additional advertisements in community newspapers and promotional advertising);
- any legal expenses other than those that are determined to be borne by the WAEC in a Court of Disputed Returns; and
- one local government staff member to work in the polling place on election day.

The WAEC is required by the Local Government Act 1995 to conduct local government elections on a full cost recovery basis and Council should note that this is an estimate only and may vary depending on a range of factors including the cost of materials or number of replies received. The basis for charges is all materials at cost and a margin on staff time only.

The current procedure required by the Local Government Act 1995 is that WA Electoral Commissioner's written agreement has to be obtained before the vote by Council is taken to undertake a postal election. In providing the cost estimate to Council, the WA Electoral Commissioner has advised that to facilitate the process, Council can take his letter including the cost estimate as the WA Electoral Commissioner's agreement to be responsible for the conduct of the local government extraordinary election for the Shire of Koorda, in accordance with section 4.20(4) of the Local Government Act 1995. This agreement is subject to the proviso that the Shire of Koorda also wishes to have the election undertaken by the WAEC as a postal election.

(1) If the office of a councillor or of an elector mayor or president becomes vacant under section 2.32 an election to fill the office is to be held.

#### 4.17. Cases in which vacant offices can remain unfilled

- (3) If a councillor's office becomes vacant under section 2.32 and under subsection (4A) this subsection applies, the council may, with the approval of the Electoral Commissioner, allow\* the vacancy to remain unfilled and, subject to subsection (4), in that case, the term of the member who held the office is to be regarded in section 4.6 as ending on the day on which it would have ended if the vacancy had not occurred.
- (4A) Subsection (3) applies —
- (a) if —
- (i) the office is for a district that has no wards; and
- (ii) at least 80% of the number of offices of member
- of the council in the district are still filled:

#### 4.9. Election day for extraordinary election

- (1) Any poll needed for an extraordinary election is to be held on a day decided on and fixed —
- (a) by the mayor or president, in writing, if a day has not already been fixed under paragraph (b); or
- (b) by the council at a meeting held within one month after the vacancy occurs, if a day has not already been fixed under paragraph (a).
- (2) The election day fixed for an extraordinary election is to be a day that allows enough time for the electoral requirements to be complied with but, unless the Electoral Commissioner approves or section 4.10(b) applies, it cannot be later than 4 months after the vacancy occurs.

#### 4.20. CEO to be returning officer unless other arrangements made

- (1) Subject to this section the CEO is the returning officer of a local government for each election.
- (2) A local government may, having first obtained the written agreement of the person concerned and the written approval of the Electoral Commissioner, appoint\* a person other than the
- CEO to be the returning officer of the local government for —
- (a) an election; or
- (b) all elections held while the appointment of the person subsists.
- \* Absolute majority required.

(3) An appointment under subsection (2) —
(a) is to specify the term of the person's appointment; and
(b) has no effect if it is made after the 80th day before an
election day.
(4) A local government may, having first obtained the written
agreement of the Electoral Commissioner, declare* the Electoral
Commissioner to be responsible for the conduct of an election,
or all elections conducted within a particular period of time,
and, if such a declaration is made, the Electoral Commissioner
is to appoint a person to be the returning officer of the local
government for the election or elections.
* Absolute majority required.

#### Financial Implications:

The \$11,000 estimate from WAEC is higher than a Shire-conducted in-person election however with the uncertainty of on-going service delivery associated with COVID-19, an in-person election may divert staff from other business operations, increase infection risk across the community and be at risk of having to be cancelled later.

It is worth noting that an unopposed postal election would be similar in cost to an unopposed inperson election.
