COVID UPDATE



Masks mandatory for Wheatbelt and **Great Southern**

Effective from 6.00pm, Thursday 27 January, mask requirements for all indoor public settings was extended the to Wheatbelt and Southern regions.

This follows more COVID-19 cases and exposure sites being detected outside the Perth, Peel and South West region.

TESTING CLINICS
