THEFTS INCREASING

KOORDA: A number of thefts have been reported in the Koorda townsite in the last week.

Two pigs around 200 pound each were stolen from a piggery on Mollerin Road last week.

Officer in charge of Koorda police station Brian Lackie said they have also heard of one person losing a couple of terra-cotta pot plants and quite a few houses with chooks being stolen.

He said they first thought the chooks were attacked by foxes, but it appears humans have stolen them.

If anyone else has had anything stolen, they have been advised to contact the police station as soon as possible.

Mr Lackie said they were not sure who

was responsible for the thefts, but said it had just started happening.

He said it could be someone new to the area or someone passing through.

Koorda police were appreciative of the efforts of local people who are now starting to report strange sightings in the area as part of the rural watch programme.

He said when the scheme was first implemented, no-one had contacted the station at all.

They are now receiving a good response from the community and were hoping it would continue.

Mr Lackie added all the sightings had been investigated and none proved fruitful, but he was pleased people were on the look out and contacting them when they saw something of a strange nature.
