Council Meeting Decisions

Ordinary Council Meeting – 20 May 2026

The following is a summary of resolutions passed by the Koorda Shire Council at the Ordinary Council Meeting held on 20 May 2026, commencing at 5pm. Full Council meeting minutes and agendas can be viewed on the Shire's website at [Past Council Meetings » Shire of Koorda](#)

Announcements by President Jannah Stratford

Shire President Cr Jannah Stratford expressed her condolences on behalf of the Shire to the Main family for the passing of John. Cr Stratford thanked all those who attended the ANZAC Day service at the Memorial Gardens, service speakers and Shire staff for organising. She welcomed the reopening of the Koorda Museum on Sundays and hoped that it would be well supported. The President also reported on the visit to the Shire by the Local Government Grants Commission and the opportunity to hear how the Federal Assistance Grant funding is calculated and provided for the Shire.

CBH Office Development Approval

Council approved a development application from CBH Group for a new office facility on the block on Orchard Street, across from the Drive-In, where the company has constructed workers accommodation. In addition to detail included in the development application, CBH also provided an updated landscaping plan for the site which covered the previous works for the workers accommodation and those intended for the new office. Though zoned residential, the office development was approved for the site following a Local Planning Scheme amendment in October 2024 which gave Council the discretion to allow the facility, which would otherwise not be permitted. Among the conditions Council placed on the approval was that vehicles no heavier than 12 tonnes could access the site. This condition was put in place to avoid excessive damage being caused to Orchard Street by heavy vehicles accessing the site entrance.

Review of the Health Local Law

The community is encouraged to participate in the review of the Shire of Koorda Health Local Law currently underway. Council endorsed the review which includes a six-week period by which the community can make submissions for Council to consider. As such a copy of the Health Local Law can be viewed at the Shire office at 10 Haig Street between 9am and 4pm Monday to Friday (excluding public holidays). The Health Local Law can also be viewed on the Shire website at www.koorda.wa.gov.au/council/local-law.aspx. The submission period will close on Monday, 6 July 2026. The purpose of the Health Local Law is to set the requirements and penalties for various matters including provision of sanitation, pest control, water supply and disposal of food and waste for types of buildings and uses.

New Council Policies

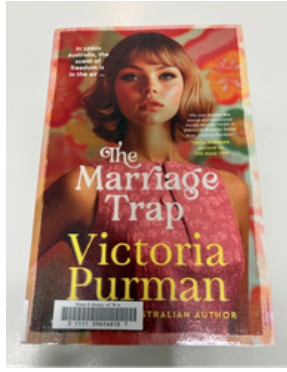
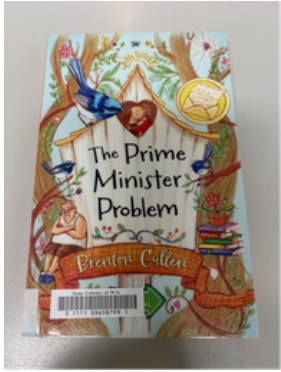
Council also endorsed a range of new policies which were mostly governance related but included one for Roadside Advertising Signage. The new policy places a limit of 2 signs that any business or group can place in total on roadside reserves with the requirement that only 1 sign be placed in any single location. The policy sets out that free standing signs should not exceed 1 metre in height or exceed a surface area of more than 1 square meter on any side. All businesses and groups wanting to install a sign need to provide details to the Shire prior to installation. Owners of existing signs have 30 days – or until Friday 19 June 2026 - to submit to the Shire details of their signs for approval. Owners of signs are to be responsible to ensure their signs are maintained in a good condition. Poorly maintained signs or those not approved will be removed by the Shire.
